Let us observe Eid in the name of humanity. Let us make our country beautiful first as the inheritors of a great civilization where everyone lived peacefully. Let us be friendly to one another with the awareness that we rejoice at the same table, we meet at the same qibla, we are the Ummah of the same Prophet, and we believe in the same Book. Let us not give an opportunity to those who want to pit us against each other. Let us free ourselves all the traps wrapped around our legs.
